• Eclipse Update – The Manager mentioned that there are 21days remaining until the eclipse. He also mentioned that he has 48 reservations. Finally, he mentioned that the diner will sell pre-made sandwiches, chips and drinks, and he also mentioned that Crosswind Aviation has decided not to provide food for the visitors.

OPEN FLOOR

- Crosswind Aviation Gwen mentioned that they have 15 students currently flying.
- TFS Randall mentioned that the air attack aircraft that deployed to T82 has been moved to San Angelo. No other deployed firefighting aircraft are at the airport.
- Rhett Hawk/Tac Aero Dawn gave a quick update for both. She mentioned that Jacobra Aviation has moved out and mentioned that the Tac Aero fly-in has been pushed back.

NEW BUSINESS

- Strategic Planning (Part 2). The Manager reviewed the AAB approved Vision Statement, Mission Statement and Core Values. He then presented the board with the draft Goal, Objectives and the Action plan.

 - A revenue system that is customer/tenant friendly while ensuring the airport is self-sufficient and private development is encouraged.
 - o Strategy/Objectives "How to achieve it":

- Implementation, with continuous updates, of the Airport layout Plan (mini master plan)
- Constant evaluation of our rates and fees with respect to the "Fair Market" values and other similar airports
- Provide mentorship, advise, and support to local schools and groups to increase enthusiasm in the airport and aviation.
- Implementation of local procedures, community standards and "best practices" to ensure "day to day" operations are within standards.
- o Action Plan "What needs to be done"
 - Encourage airport tenants and business involvement with hosting/participating in community events to encourage interest in aviation and the airport.
 - Inspire airport tenants and business participation with the local schools to help with the development/expansion of the AOPA high school curriculum.
 - Continuous Review and Update of the Airport Rules and Regulations, and Minimum Standards
 - Update the "Rates and Fees" document every September (CPI update)
 - Update the airport action plan on an annual basis (Every January).
- o The board unanimously approved all, with the exception that they wanted the manager to modify the objectives by putting action verbs at the beginning of the sentences.
- Quotes. The Manager presented the board with quotes for 2 separate projects.
 - o 1st project (pavement rehab at the north end) Scope: crack seal and slurry.



- The manager provided the board with 2 quotes (alpha paving and sealcoat specialist). The board unanimously approved the project, and the quote from Sealcoat (for \$20,097.63) (lowest bid).
- o 2nd project (relocation of the fence that is located south of Hwy 16.



■ The manager provided the board with 2 quotes (Home and Ranch and Jakob Crenwelge). The board unanimously approved the project, and the quote from Home and Ranch (for \$10,535.45) (lowest bid), but Comm Kramer wanted the manager to get another quote because he said the Court would not accept the 2nd quote (from Jakob Crenwelge).

OLD BUSINESS.

- CIP Update The Manager gave a quick update on the pavement project. He mentioned that the RFQ deadline is Mar 28th. As for the obstacle clearance study (18B), the manager said that no progress has been made.
- Terminal Building Expansion The Manager gave a quick update. He stated that he met with an architect from Mustard Design and requested a proposal for a conceptual design. The board also made it clear that they did not support creating rentable offices in the design.
- Project update (electricity to front) The Manager mentioned that he was waiting on ITZ electric.


EAA Report – Steve provided a quick update.

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



Dear Gillespie Air Services, thank you for the opportunity to provide you with this proposal. We look forward to answering any questions you may have and working with you on this project.

Crackfill up to 7,350 linear feet of transverse and lateral asphalt pavement cracking.

- This work is performed by cleaning debris and grass from most of the 1/4" width to 1" width transverse and lateral pavement cracks and sealing most (not all) of them.
 Cracks under cas and "alignatored", spider cracked pavement will not be treated.
 We will only install up to the quantity specified above. If Purchaser requests additional crackfill over the above linear footage, work will be completed and Purchaser agrees to pay Contractor \$.65 per linear foot for additional crackfill.

PREMIUM PAVEMENT SEALCOAT (TARC P-631)

We will install 57,452 sf of Premium Sealcoat

- Clean pavement with blowers/brooms and apply 2 coats of Premium Sealcoat.
 Work to be done in (1) PHASE. Each additional phase requested and \$2000.
 All sealcoat wears over time at varying rates depending on usage and traffic.
 Minor wearing / power steering marks can be expected in highest traffic areas





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
